Subject: IPCC Special Report on Global Warming of 1.5°C

Sir/Madam,

I have the honour of addressing you on the matter of the government review of the Final Draft of the Summary for Policymakers (SPM) of the IPCC "Special Report on Global Warming of 1.5°C, an IPCC special report on the impacts of global warming of 1.5°C above pre-industrial levels and related global greenhouse gas emission pathways, in the context of strengthening the global response to the threat of climate change, sustainable development, and efforts to eradicate poverty".

You may recall that the Conference of the Parties to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) at the twenty-first session (COP-21), in its decision on the adoption of the Paris Agreement, explicitly invited the IPCC to provide a Special Report in 2018 on the impacts of global warming of 1.5°C above pre-industrial levels and related global greenhouse gas emission pathways. At the 43<sup>rd</sup> Session of the IPCC (11-13 April 2016, Nairobi, Kenya) the Panel accepted UNFCCC's invitation to prepare the Special Report on 1.5°C in 2018 in the context of strengthening the global response to the threat of climate change, sustainable development and efforts to eradicate poverty. Following a Scoping Meeting in Geneva, Switzerland, in August 2016, the outline of the Special Report on Global Warming of 1.5°C was approved at the 44<sup>th</sup> Session of the IPCC (17-20 October 2016, Bangkok, Thailand).

As mandated by IPCC rules and procedures, the First Order Draft (FOD) of the Special Report on Global Warming of 1.5°C underwent Expert Review from 31 July to 24 September 2017 and was revised by the authors to produce the Second Order Draft (SOD). The SOD underwent Government and Expert Review from 8 January to 25 February 2018. Subsequently authors have incorporated government and expert comments in the SOD to produce the final draft.

I have the pleasure to inform you that the Final Draft of the Summary for Policymakers is available for your consideration and review **from 4 June to 29 July 2018 midnight (GMT +2**). The aim of the review is to ensure that the SPM is accurate, well-balanced and presents the findings of the underlying report clearly, and is consistent with the scope of the full report as approved by the Panel. To this end your review comments will be most helpful if they:

 Address specific text, tables or figures in the draft and provide clear suggestions for changes in wording or content where appropriate. Please provide full references for any additional literature cited in a review comment.





- Take account of the specific mandates of IPCC and of Working Groups I, II and III together
  with the approved outline of the report and do not require the authors to go beyond that
  scope.
- Ensure that any suggested changes to the SPM are fully consistent with material in the chapters of the full report and provide cross references to that material.
- Take into account that the authors are required to work within strict length constraints and
  must present a concise assessment of current knowledge, not a scientific review of how that
  knowledge was derived.
- Give attention to ways of shortening the chapters and the SPM where possible.
- Editorial comments can be provided, but please note that text styles including standardized spelling, use of units, etc., will be corrected as necessary in subsequent proof reading steps. Detailed comments on typographical errors are not generally of use at this stage.

The SPM drafting authors will consider the comments on the SPM at a meeting to be held in Incheon, Republic of Korea, from 28-29 September 2018, immediately preceding the 1<sup>st</sup> Joint Session of Working Groups I, II and III. The draft SPM will then be submitted to the 1<sup>st</sup> Joint Session of the Working Groups, starting on 1 October 2018 at the same venue, for line-by-line approval. The full Final Draft Report will be submitted for acceptance by the 1<sup>st</sup> Joint Session of Working Groups I, II and III. Subsequently, in accordance with IPCC procedures, the approved SPM and the accepted underlying Report will be submitted to the IPCC for formal acceptance at its Forty-eighth Session, to be held at the same venue from 1-5 October 2018.

To facilitate the consideration of the Summary for Policymakers at the approval Session I kindly invite you to submit your government comments by **29 July 2018 midnight (GMT +2)**. Details on how to access the draft report and submit your comments are provided below.

Please note that all comments will be published attributable by country following the final approval and publication of the report.

Please note that these are confidential documents which must not be distributed, cited or quoted. We therefore kindly request you not to share the access code to the draft report.

## Preparation and submission of review comments:

Please prepare your review comments using the Microsoft Excel spreadsheet that can be downloaded from the web site given above. Given the large number of comments that are received on IPCC draft reports and the limited time available to collate these in a form that can be used by the authors, I must ask that you use this exact format **and no other** (e.g. Word, PDF, self-generated excel, etc). Each spreadsheet can accommodate up to 1000 comments. For those Governments that anticipate submitting more than 1000 comments I ask that you prepare separate spreadsheets for each section of the SPM.
